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Course Description: The standards for Grade Seven General Music build upon students' musical knowledge and skills through increasingly complex experiences in singing, playing instruments, performing rhythms, moving to music, and creating music through processes such as composition, improvisation, and arranging. Exploration of music theory continues as students read and write increasingly complex music notation. Students use critical thinking to compare and contrast the functions of music and investigate the impact of musicians, music consumers, and music advocates on the community. Students define, organize, and share personal ideas, investigations, and research of music ideas and concepts as part of a creative process. Students respond to, describe, interpret, and evaluate music and experience music from a variety of cultural influences, styles, composers, and historical periods. They compare and contrast career pathways in music and identify relationships between music and other fine arts.

- Exercise critical-thinking skills by investigating and analyzing all facets of music discipline.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the relationship of music to history and culture.
- Make connections between music and other fields of knowledge
- Demonstrate the ability to apply aesthetic criteria for making musical decisions.
- Nurture a lifelong appreciation for music as an integral component of an educated, cultured society.
